Bream Creek Vineyard is one of the pioneers of the modern Tasmanian wine industry. Our 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1974, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted what was arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape variety Schönburger in the southern hemisphere. Since 1990 our premium cool climate wine has been rewarded with 55 trophies and more than 1,000 show medals.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2021 was a fairly cool vintage with a single major rain event. With the vines being unstressed by heat, they surprised us with their ripening power to produce some excellent parcels of grapes - a great advantage of cool climate viticulture!

This wine, made from a rare German grape, shows its traditional complex nose of roses, white flowers and green melon. The palate is luscious and persistent, with lychee, rosewater, melon and musk flavours and a refreshing, clean finish. While ideal with sushi, shellfish or Asian style cuisine, this rare German variety can complement an unusually wide range of foods.
